1. WHY IS ST DAVIDS DIOCESE WALKING 408 MILES?

The United Nations Climate Conference (COP26) is being held in November, when governments will try to commit to reduce emissions to avoid a climate disaster. St Davids Diocese is committed to praying for the success of this conference and drawing the world's attention to the fact that we are running out of time to save the planet that God has entrusted to us. Together we are completing a virtual walk to Glasgow in time for COP26.

2. CAN ANYONE JOIN IN?

We would love all you walkers to join us. St Davids Cathedral Education & Pilgrimage Centre will guide you on a circular 8 mile route along mostly uneven and moderately difficult inland footpaths and the Pembrokeshire National Coastpath, beginning near the Cathedral. Bring a picnic (refreshment kiosk on the route) and enjoy time walking with others and hearing the stories and prayers concerning this part of God's Creation.

3. HAVE YOU FALLEN BEHIND WITH YOUR DAILY STEP COUNT?

People of the Diocese have been walking 2 miles a day since the 1st March so that by 1st November the 408 miles to Glasgow will be completed. If you find you haven't quite kept up with this, now's the time to catch up!
