### **Ezekiel 36. 24-28**

I will take you from the nations, and gather you from all the countries, and bring you into your own land. I will sprinkle clean water upon you, and you shall be clean from all your uncleannesses, and from all your idols I will cleanse you. A new heart I will give you, and a new spirit I will put within you; and I will remove from your body the heart of stone and give you a heart of flesh. I will put my spirit within you, and make you follow my statutes and be careful to observe my ordinances. Then you shall live in the land that I gave to your ancestors; and you shall be my people, and I will be your God.

### **Eseciel 36. 24-28**

Oherwydd byddaf yn eich cymryd o blith y cenedloedd, yn eich casglu o'r holl wledydd, ac yn dod â chwi i'ch gwlad eich hunain. Taenellaf ddŵr glân drosoch i'ch glanhau; a byddwch yn lân o'ch holl aflendid ac o'ch holl eilunod. Rhof i chwi galon newydd, a bydd ysbryd newydd ynoch; tynnaf allan ohonoch y galon garreg, a rhof i chwi galon gig. Rhof fy ysbryd ynoch, a gwneud ichwi ddilyn fy neddfau a gofalu cadw fy ngorchmynion. Byddwch yn byw yn y tir a roddais i'ch hynafiaid; byddwch yn bobl i mi, a minnau'n Dduw i chwi.

### **Acts 1. 6-14**

So when they had come together, they asked him, 'Lord, is this the time when you will restore the kingdom to Israel?' He replied, 'It is not for you to know the times or periods that the Father has set by his own authority. But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth.' When he had said this, as they were watching, he was lifted up, and a cloud took him out of their sight. While he was going and they were gazing up towards heaven, suddenly two men in white robes stood by them. They said, 'Men of Galilee, why do you stand looking up towards heaven? This Jesus, who has been taken up from you into heaven, will come in the same way as you saw him go into heaven.' Then they returned to Jerusalem from the mount called Olivet, which is near Jerusalem, a sabbath day's journey away. When they had entered the city, they went to the room upstairs where they were staying, Peter, and John, and James, and Andrew, Philip and Thomas, Bartholomew and Matthew, James son of Alphaeus, and Simon the Zealot, and Judas son of James. All these were constantly devoting themselves to prayer, together with certain women, including Mary the mother of Jesus, as well as his brothers.

### **Actau 1. 6-14**

Felly, wedi iddynt ddod ynghyd, fe ofynasant iddo, "Arglwydd, ai dyma'r adeg yr wyt ti am adfer y deyrnas i Israel?" Dywedodd yntau wrthynt, "Nid chwi sydd i wybod amseroedd neu brydiau y mae'r Tad wedi eu gosod o fewn ei awdurdod ef ei hun. Ond fe dderbyniwch nerth wedi i'r Ysbryd Glân ddod arnoch, a byddwch yn dystion i mi yn Jerwsalem, ac yn holl Jwdea a Samaria, a hyd eithaf y ddaear." Wedi iddo ddweud hyn, a hwythau'n edrych, fe'i dyrchafwyd, a chipiodd cwmwl ef o'u golwg. Fel yr oeddent yn syllu tua'r nef, ac yntau'n mynd, dyma ddau ŵr yn sefyll yn eu hymyl mewn dillad gwyn, ac meddai'r rhain, "Wŷr Galilea, pam yr ydych yn sefyll yn edrych tua'r nef? Yr Iesu hwn, sydd wedi ei gymryd i fyny oddi wrthynt i'r nef, bydd yn dod yn yr un modd ag y gwelsoch ef yn mynd i'r nef." Yna dychwelsant i Jerwsalem o'r mynydd a elwir Olewydd, sydd yn agos i Jerwsalem, daith Saboth oddi yno. Wedi cyrraedd, aethant i fyny i'r oruwchystafell, lle'r oeddent yn aros: Pedr ac Ioan ac Iago ac Andreas, Philip a Thomas, Bartholomeus a Mathew, Iago fab Alffeus a Simon y Selot a Jwdas fab Iago. Yr oedd y rhain oll yn dyfalbarhau yn unfryd mewn gweddi, ynghyd â rhai gwragedd a Mair, mam Iesu, a chyda'i frodyr.

### **Psalm 68. 1-10**

Let God arise and let his enemies be scattered: let those that hate him flee before him.  
As the smoke vanishes, so may they vanish away: as wax melts at the fire, so let the wicked perish at the presence of God.  
But let the righteous be glad and rejoice before God: let them make merry with gladness.  
Sing to God, sing praises to his name; exalt him who rides on the clouds: the Lord is his name; rejoice before him.  
Father of the fatherless, defender of widows: God in his holy habitation!  
God gives the solitary a home and brings forth prisoners to songs of welcome: but the rebellious inhabit a burning desert.  
O God, when you went forth before your people: when you marched through the wilderness,  
The earth shook and the heavens dropped down rain, at the presence of God, the Lord of Sinai:  
at the presence of God, the God of Israel.  
You sent down a gracious rain, O God: you refreshed your inheritance when it was weary.  
Your people came to dwell there: in your goodness, O God, you provide for the poor.

### **Salm 68. 1-10**

Bydded i Dduw godi ac i'w elynion wasgaru: ac i'r rhai sy'n ei gasáu – ffoi o'i flaen.  
Fel y chwelir mwg, chwâl hwy: fel cwyr yn toddi o flaen tân bydded i'r drygionus ddarfod o flaen Duw.  
Ond y mae'r cyfiawn yn llawenhau: y maent yn gorfoleddu gerbron Duw ac yn ymhyfrydu mewn llawenydd.  
Canwch i Dduw molwch ei enw: paratowch ffordd i'r un sy'n marchogaeth trwy'r anialdir yr Arglwydd yw ei enw gorfoleddwch o'i flaen.

Tad yr amddifaid ac amddiffynnydd y gweddwon: yw Duw yn ei drigfan sanctaidd. Mae Duw yn gosod yr unig mewn cartref ac yn arwain allan garcharorion mewn llawenydd: ond y mae'r gwrthryfelwyr yn byw mewn diffeithwch.

O Dduw, pan aethost ti allan o flaen dy bobl: a gorymdeithio ar draws yr anialwch, Crynodd y ddaear a glawiodd y nefoedd o flaen Duw, Duw Sinai: o flaen Duw, Duw Israel. Tywelltaist ddigonedd o law, O Dduw: ac adfer dy etifeddiaeth pan oedd ar ddiffygio; Cafodd dy braidd le i fyw ynnddi: ac yn dy ddaioni darperaist i'r anghenus, O Dduw.

### **John 17. 1-11**

After Jesus had spoken these words, he looked up to heaven and said, 'Father, the hour has come; glorify your Son so that the Son may glorify you, since you have given him authority over all people, to give eternal life to all whom you have given him. And this is eternal life, that they may know you, the only true God, and Jesus Christ whom you have sent. I glorified you on earth by finishing the work that you gave me to do. So now, Father, glorify me in your own presence with the glory that I had in your presence before the world existed. 'I have made your name known to those whom you gave me from the world. They were yours, and you gave them to me, and they have kept your word. Now they know that everything you have given me is from you; for the words that you gave to me I have given to them, and they have received them and know in truth that I came from you; and they have believed that you sent me. I am asking on their behalf; I am not asking on behalf of the world, but on behalf of those whom you gave me, because they are yours. All mine are yours, and yours are mine; and I have been glorified in them. And now I am no longer in the world, but they are in the world, and I am coming to you. Holy Father, protect them in your name that you have given me, so that they may be one, as we are one.

### **Ioan 17. 1-11**

Wedi iddo lefaru'r geiriau hyn, cododd Iesu ei lygaid i'r nef a dywedodd: "O Dad, y mae'r awr wedi dod. Gogonedda dy Fab, er mwyn i'r Mab dy ogoneddu di. Oherwydd rhoddaist iddo ef awdurdod ar bob un, awdurdod i roi bywyd tragwyddol i bawb yr wyt ti wedi eu rhoi iddo ef. A hyn yw bywyd tragwyddol: dy adnabod di, yr unig wir Dduw, a'r hwn a anfonaist ti, Iesu Grist. Yr wyf fi wedi dy ogoneddu ar y ddaear trwy orffen y gwaith a roddaist imi i'w wneud. Yn awr, O Dad, gogonedda di fyfi ger dy fron dy hun â'r gogoniant oedd i mi ger dy fron cyn bod y byd. "Yr wyf wedi amlygu dy enw i'r rhai a roddaist imi allan o'r byd. Eiddot ti oeddent, ac fe'u rhoddaist i mi. Y maent wedi cadw dy air di. Y maent yn gwybod yn awr mai oddi wrthyt ti y mae popeth a roddaist i mi. Oherwydd yr wyf wedi rhoi iddynt hwy y geiriau a roddaist ti i mi, a hwythau wedi eu derbyn, a chanfod mewn gwirionedd mai oddi wrthyt ti y deuthum, a chredu mai ti a'm hanfonodd i. Drostynt hwy yr wyf fi'n gweddio. Nid dros y byd yr wyf yn gweddio, ond dros y rhai a roddaist imi, oherwydd eiddot ti ydynt. Y mae popeth sy'n eiddof fi yn eiddot ti, a'r eiddot ti yn eiddof fi. Ac yr wyf fi wedi fy ngogoneddu ynndynt hwy. Nid wyf fi mwyach yn y byd, ond y maent hwy yn y byd. Yr wyf fi'n dod atat ti. O Dad sanctaidd, cadw hwy'n ddiogel trwy dy enw, yr enw a roddaist i mi, er mwyn iddynt fod yn un fel yr ydym ni yn un.

When thou lettest thy breath go forth they are made strong; and thou renewest the face of the earth.

May the glorious majesty of the Lord endure for ever: may the Lord rejoice in his works.

The earth trembleth when he looketh upon it: if he do but touch the hill- they shall smoke.

I will sing unto the Lord as long as I live: I will praise my God while I have my being.

May my meditation please him: my joy shall be in the Lord.

Let sinners be consumed out of the earth, and the wicked come to an end: praise thou the Lord

O my soul. Praise ye the Lord.

**Cathedral Treasury** - On public display in the Cathedral Treasury are rare artefacts and communion ware from the medieval, Tudor, Stuart and later periods. In the Library cases is one of the Cathedral's copies of the 403-year-old Welsh Bible from 1620 with its original wooden covers.

You will see rare surviving medieval paintings that would have originally covered the inside of the building with masses of colour.
