### Collect

God, who at this time taught the hearts of your faithful people by sending to them the light of your Holy Spirit: grant us by the same Spirit to have a right judgement in all things and evermore

to rejoice in his holy comfort; through the merits of Christ Jesus our Saviour, who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. **Amen.**

### **Colect**

O Dduw, a ddysgaist yr adeg hon galonnau dy ffyddloniaid trwy anfon atynt oleuni dy Ysbryd Glân, dyro i ni drwy'r un Ysbryd feddu barn gywir ym mhob peth a llawenhau byth yn ei ddiddanwch sanctaidd; drwy haeddiannau Crist Iesu ein Gwarddwr, sy'n fyw ac yn teyrnasu gyda thi, yn undod yr Ysbryd Glân, yn un Duw, yn awr ac am byth. **Amen.**

### **Numbers 11. 24-30**

So Moses went out and told the people the words of the Lord; and he gathered seventy elders of the people, and placed them all around the tent. Then the Lord came down in the cloud and spoke to him, and took some of the spirit that was on him and put it on the seventy elders; and when the spirit rested upon them, they prophesied. But they did not do so again. Two men remained in the camp, one named Eldad, and the other named Medad, and the spirit rested on them; they were among those registered, but they had not gone out to the tent, and so they prophesied in the camp. And a young man ran and told Moses, 'Eldad and Medad are prophesying in the camp.' And Joshua son of Nun, the assistant of Moses, one of his chosen men, said, 'My lord Moses, stop them!' But Moses said to him, 'Are you jealous for my sake? Would that all the Lord's people were prophets, and that the Lord would put his spirit on them!' And Moses and the elders of Israel returned to the camp.

### **Numeri 11. 24-30**

Aeth Moses ymaith a mynegi i'r bobl eiriau'r Arglwydd; yna casglodd ddeg a thrigain o henuriaid y bobl a'u gosod o amgylch y babell. Daeth yr Arglwydd i lawr mewn cwmwl, a llefaru wrtho, a chymerodd yr Arglwydd beth o'r ysbryd oedd arno ef a'i roi ar yr henuriaid, y deg a thrigain ohonynt; pan orffwysai'r ysbryd arnynt, byddent yn proffwydo, ond ni wnaent ragor na hynny. Arhosodd dau o'r dynion yn y gwerysll; eu henwau oedd Eldad a Medad, a gorffwysodd yr ysbryd arnynt hwythau. Yr oeddent hwy ymhlith y rhai a gofrestrwyd, ond am nad oedd-ent wedi mynd allan i'r babell, proffwydasant yn y gwerysll. Pan redodd llanc ifanc a mynegi i Moses fod Eldad a Medad yn proffwydo yn y gwerysll, dywedodd Josua fab Nun, a fu'n gweini ar Moses o'i ieuentid, "Moses, f'arglwydd, rhwystra hwy." Ond dywedodd Moses wrtho, "Ai o'm hachos i yr wyt yn eiddigeddus? O na byddai holl bobl yr Arglwydd yn broffwydi, ac y byddai ef yn rhoi ei ysbryd arnynt!" Yna dychwelodd Moses a henuriaid Israel i'r gwerysll.

### **Acts 2. 1-21**

When the day of Pentecost had come, they were all together in one place. And suddenly from heaven there came a sound like the rush of a violent wind, and it filled the entire house where they were sitting. Divided tongues, as of fire, appeared among them, and a tongue rested on each of them. All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other languages, as the Spirit gave them ability. Now there were devout Jews from every nation under heaven living in Jerusalem. And at this sound the crowd gathered and was bewildered, because each one heard

them speaking in the native language of each. Amazed and astonished, they asked, 'Are not all these who are speaking Galileans? And how is it that we hear, each of us, in our own native language? Parthians, Medes, Elamites, and residents of Mesopotamia, Judea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya belonging to Cyrene, and visitors from Rome, both Jews and proselytes, Cretans and Arabs - in our own languages we hear them speaking about God's deeds of power.' All were amazed and perplexed, saying to one another, 'What does this mean?' But others sneered and said, 'They are filled with new wine.' But Peter, standing with the eleven, raised his voice and addressed them: 'Men of Judea and all who live in Jerusalem, let this be known to you, and listen to what I say. Indeed, these are not drunk, as you suppose, for it is only nine o'clock in the morning. No, this is what was spoken through the prophet Joel: "In the last days it will be, God declares, that I will pour out my Spirit upon all flesh, and your sons and your daughters shall prophesy, and your young men shall see visions, and your old men shall dream dreams. Even upon my slaves, both men and women, in those days I will pour out my Spirit; and they shall prophesy. And I will show portents in the heaven above and signs on the earth below, blood, and fire, and smoky mist. The sun shall be turned to darkness and the moon to blood, before the coming of the Lord's great and glorious day. Then everyone who calls on the name of the Lord shall be saved."

## **Actau 2. 1-21**

Ar ddydd cyflawni cyfnod y Pentecost yr oeddent oll ynghyd yn yr un lle, ac yn sydyn fe ddaeth o'r nef sŵn fel gwynt grymus yn rhuthro, ac fe lanwodd yr holl dŷ lle'r oeddent yn eistedd. Ymddangosodd iddynt dafodau fel o dân yn ymrannu ac yn eistedd un ar bob un ohonynt; a llanwyd hwy oll â'r Ysbryd Glân, a dechreusant lefaru â thafodau dieithr, fel yr oedd yr Ysbryd yn rhoi lleferydd iddynt. Yr oedd yn preswyllo yn Jerwsalem Iddewon, pobl dduwiol o bob cenedl dan y nef; ac wrth glywed y sŵn hwn fe ymgasglodd tyrfa ohonynt, ac yr oeddent wedi drysu'n lân am fod pob un ohonynt yn eu clywed hwy yn siarad yn ei iaith ei hun. Yr oeddent yn synnu a rhyfeddu, ac meddent, "Onid Galileaid yw'r rhain oll sy'n llefaru? A sut yr ydym ni yn eu clywed bob un ohonom yn ei iaith ei hun, iaith ei fam? Parthiaid a Mediaid ac Elamitiaid, a thrigolion Mesopotamia, Jwdea a Capadocia, Pontus ac Asia, Phrygia a Pamffylia, yr Aifft a pharthau Libya tua Cyrene, a'r ymwelwyr o Rufain, yn Iddewon a phroselytiaid, Cretiaid ac Arabiaid, yr ydym yn eu clywed hwy yn llefaru yn ein hieithoedd ni am fawrion weithredoedd Duw." Yr oedd pawb yn synnu mewn penbleth, gan ddweud y naill wrth y llall, "Beth yw ystyr hyn?" Ond yr oedd eraill yn dweud yn wawdlyd, "Wedi meddwi y maent." Safodd Pedr ynghyd â'r un ar ddeg, a chododd ei lais a'u hannerch: "Chwi Iddewon, a thrigolion Jerwsalem oll, bydded hyn yn hysbys i chwi; gwrandewch ar fy ngeiriau. Nid yw'r rhain wedi meddwi, fel yr ydych chi'n tybio, oherwydd dim ond naw o'r gloch y bore yw hi. Eithr dyma'r hyn a ddywedwyd drwy'r proffwyd Joel: 'A hyn a fydd yn y dyddiau olaf, medd Duw: tywalltaf o'm Hysbryd ar bawb; a bydd eich meibion a'ch merched yn proffwydo; bydd eich gwŷr ifainc yn cael gweledigaethau, a'ch hynafgwyr yn gweld breuddwydion; hyd yn oed ar fy nghaethweision a'm caethforynion, yn y dyddiau hynny, fe dywalltaf o'm Hysbryd, ac fe broffwydant. A rhof ryfeddodau yn y nef uchod ac arwyddion ar y ddaear isod, gwaed a thân a tharth mwg; troir yr

haul yn dywyllwch, a'r lleuad yn waed, cyn i ddydd mawr a disglair yr Arglwydd ddod; a bydd pob un sy'n galw ar enw'r Arglwydd yn cael ei achub.'

### **Psalm 104. 24-36**

O Lord, how manifold are your works!: In wisdom you have made them all; the earth is full of your creatures.

I will sing to the Lord as long as I live: I will make music to my God while I have my being.

So shall my song please him: while I rejoice in the Lord.

Let sinners be consumed out of the earth: and the wicked be no more.

Bless the Lord, O my soul: Alleluia, Alleluia.

Bydded fy myfyrdod yn gymeradwy ganddo: yr wyf yn llawenhau – yn yr Arglwydd.

Bydded i'r pechaduriaid ddarfod o'r tir ac na fydded y drygionus mwyach: fy enaid, bendithia'r Arglwydd. Molwch yr Arglwydd.

### **John 20. 19-23**

When it was evening on that day, the first day of the week, and the doors of the house where the disciples had met were locked for fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood among them and said,

'Peace be with you.' After he said this, he showed them his hands and his side. Then the disciples rejoiced when they saw the Lord. Jesus said to them again, 'Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you.' When he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them, 'Receive the Holy Spirit. If you forgive the sins of any, they are forgiven them; if you retain the sins of any, they are retained.'

### **Ioan 20. 19-23**

Os maddeuwch bechodau rhywun, y maent wedi eu maddau; os peidiwch â'u maddau, y maent heb eu maddau."

## Neil Cox - The Pilgrimage

This evening's service of Choral Evensong features the first performance of Neil Cox's Anthem 'The Pilgrimage'. St Davids Cathedral Choir commissioned Neil to compose this anthem to mark our Diocesan Year of Pilgrimage 2023, commemorating the 900th anniversary of Pope Calixtus II's edict stating that two pilgrimages to St Davids were equal to one to Rome. The text of the anthem, a combination of the poetry of Sir Walter Raleigh and the appearance of Jesus on the road to Emmaus taken from Luke's gospel, is presented below:

*Give me my scallop shell of quiet, my staff of faith to walk upon,  
My scrip of joy, immortal diet,  
My bottle of salvation,  
My gown of glory, hope's true gauge:  
And thus I'll take my pilgrimage.*

### **On the road to Emmaus**

*And as they drew near to where they were going, He made as though he would go further, but they pleaded with him, bide with us, for evening shadows darken, and the day will soon be over. So he went in to stay with them, and as they sat down to eat, he took the bread and blessed it, and he broke it, and gave the bread to them, and their eyes were opened, and they knew Him.*

*Give me my scallop shell of quiet, my staff of faith to walk upon,  
My scrip of joy, immortal diet,  
My bottle of salvation,  
My gown of glory, hope's true gauge:  
And thus I'll take my pilgrimage.*

Neil Cox was born in 1955 in Llanelli, where he attended the Boys' Grammar School. An organ scholarship to Cambridge followed, along with the Fellowship diploma of the Royal College of Organists. After Cambridge he became Director of Music in Lancing College Chapel, a building of cathedral-like proportions, and over the years many of his students from Lancing have gone on to sing and play in the most prestigious cathedrals, choirs and ensembles in the UK. His compositions have been performed widely, and his extra-musical hobbies include oil painting, fishing and tasting good beer.
