Collect

Almighty God, whose only Son has opened for us a new and living way into your presence: give us pure hearts and steadfast wills to worship you in spirit and in truth; through Jesus Christ your Son our Lord, who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. **Amen.**

Colect

Hollalluog Dduw, yr agorodd dy unig Fab inni ffordd newydd a bywiol i'th bresenoldeb, dyro inni galonnau pur ac ewyllys gadarn i'th addoli mewn ysbryd a gwirionedd; trwy Iesu Grist dy Fab ein Harglwydd, sy'n fyw ac yn teyrnasu gyda thi, yn undod yr Ysbryd Glân, yn un Duw, yn awr ac am byth. **Amen.**

Genesis 50. 15-21

Realizing that their father was dead, Joseph's brothers said, 'What if Joseph still bears a grudge against us and pays us back in full for all the wrong that we did to him?' So they approached Joseph, saying, 'Your father gave this instruction before he died, "Say to Joseph: I beg you, forgive the crime of your brothers and the wrong they did in harming you." Now therefore please forgive the crime of the servants of the God of your father.' Joseph wept when they spoke to him. Then his brothers also wept, fell down before him, and said, 'We are here as your slaves.' But Joseph said to them, 'Do not be afraid! Am I in the place of God? Even though you intended to do harm to me, God intended it for good, in order to preserve a numerous people, as he is doing today. So have no fear; I myself will provide for you and your little ones.' In this way he reassured them, speaking kindly to them.

Genesis 50. 15-21

Romans 14. 1-12

Welcome those who are weak in faith, but not for the purpose of quarrelling over opinions. Some believe in eating anything, while the weak eat only vegetables. Those who eat must not despise those who abstain, and those who abstain must not pass judgement on those who eat; for God has welcomed them. Who are you to pass judgement on servants of another? It is before their own lord that they stand or fall. And they will be upheld, for the Lord is able to make them stand. Some judge one day to be better than another, while others judge all days to be alike. Let all be

fully convinced in their own minds. Those who observe the day, observe it in honour of the Lord. Also those who eat, eat in honour of the Lord, since they give thanks to God; while those who abstain, abstain in honour of the Lord and give thanks to God. We do not live to ourselves, and we do not die to ourselves. If we live, we live to the Lord, and if we die, we die to the Lord; so then, whether we live or whether we die, we are the Lord's. For to this end Christ died and lived again, so that he might be Lord of both the dead and the living. Why do you pass judgement on your brother or sister? Or you, why do you despise your brother or sister? For we will all stand before the judgement seat of God. For it is written, 'As I live, says the Lord, every knee shall bow to me, and every tongue shall give praise to God.' So then, each of us will be accountable to God.

Then Peter came and said to him, 'Lord, if another member of the church sins against me, how often should I forgive? As many as seven times?' Jesus said to him, 'Not seven times, but, I tell you, seventy-seven times. 'For this reason the kingdom of heaven may be compared to a king who wished to settle accounts with his slaves. When he began the reckoning, one who owed him ten thousand talents was brought to him; and, as he could not pay, his lord ordered him to be sold, together with his wife and children and all his possessions, and payment to be made. So the slave fell on his knees before him, saying, "Have patience with me, and I will pay you everything." And out of pity for him, the lord of that slave released him and forgave him the debt. But that same slave, as he went out, came upon one of his fellow-slaves who owed him a hundred denarii; and seizing him by the throat, he said, "Pay what you owe." Then his fellowslave fell down and pleaded with him, "Have patience with me, and I will pay you." But he refused; then he went and threw him into prison until he should pay the debt. When his fellowslaves saw what had happened, they were greatly distressed, and they went and reported to their lord all that had taken place. Then his lord summoned him and said to him, "You wicked slave! I forgave you all that debt because you pleaded with me. Should you not have had mercy on your fellow-slave, as I had mercy on you?" And in anger his lord handed him over to be tortured until he should pay his entire debt. So my heavenly Father will also do to every one of you, if you do not forgive your brother or sister from your heart.'

Mathew 18. 21-35

Yna daeth Pedr a gofyn iddo, "Arglwydd, pa sawl gwaith y mae fy nghyfaill i bechu yn fy erbyn a minnau i faddau iddo? Ai hyd seithwaith?" Meddai Iesu wrtho, "Nid hyd seithwaith a ddywedaf wrthyt, ond hyd saith deg seithwaith. Am hynny y mae teyrnas nefoedd yn debyg i frenin a benderfynodd adolygu cyfrifon ei weision. Dechreuodd ar y gwaith, a dygwyd ato was oedd yn ei ddyled o ddeng mil o godau o arian. A chan na allai dalu gorchmynnodd ei feistr iddo gael ei werthu, ynghyd â'i wraig a'i blant a phopeth a feddai, er mwyn talu'r ddyled. Syrthiodd y gwas ar ei liniau o flaen ei feistr a dweud, 'Bydd yn amyneddgar wrthyf, ac fe dalaf y cwbl iti.' A thosturiodd meistr y gwas hwnnw wrtho; gollyngodd ef yn rhydd a maddau'r ddyled iddo. Aeth y gwas hwnnw allan a daeth o hyd i un o'i gydweision a oedd yn ei ddyled ef o gant o ddarnau arian; ymaflodd ynddo gerfydd ei wddf gan ddweud, 'Tâl dy ddyled.' Syrthiodd ei gydwas i lawr a chrefodd arno, 'Bydd yn amyneddgar wrthyf, ac fe dalaf iti.' Ond gwrthododd; yn hytrach fe aeth a'i fwrw i garchar hyd nes y talai'r ddyled. Pan welodd ei gydweision beth oedd wedi digwydd, fe'u blinwyd yn fawr iawn, ac aethant ac adrodd yr holl hanes wrth eu meistr. Yna galwodd ei feistr ef ato, ac meddai, 'Y gwas drwg, fe faddeuais i yr holl ddyled honno i ti, am iti grefu arnaf. Oni ddylit tithau fod wedi trugarhau wrth dy gydwas, fel y gwneuthum i wrthyt ti?' Library

Cathedral Library - The Cathedral Library is open to the public on Fridays and Mondays 2pm to 4pm. No bookings needed. Any Enquiries to: <u>Library@StDavidsCathedral.org.uk</u>. The Library is reached via a spiral medieval stone staircase adjacent to the Shrine of St David in the north presbytery aisle.

Cathedral Treasury - On public display in the Cathedral Treasury are rare artefacts and communion ware from the medieval, Tudor, Stuart and later periods. In the Library cases is one of the Cathedral's copies of the 403-year-old Welsh Bible from 1620 with its original wooden covers. Proceeds from the Donation Box go towards conservation and care of the Cathedral's Collection of Rare Books and artefacts.

Tours of Rarely Seen parts of St Davids Cathedral – The next two Tours in this series are on Wednesday 20th September 2pm-3.30pm and on Wednesday 25th October 2pm-3.30pm. An opportunity to view some parts of this special building that are rarely seen. You will see rare surviving medieval paintings that would have originally covered the inside of the building with masses of colour. STILE ANTICO PRESENT 'ENGLAND'S NIGHTINGALE'

A Celebration of William Byrd to mark the 400th anniversary year of his death
