God our redeemer, who prepared the Blessed Virgin Mary to be the mother of your Son: grant that, as she looked for his coming as our Saviour, so we may be ready to greet him when he comes again as our judge; who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. **Amen.**

Colect

Dduw ein gwaredwr, a roddaist y Forwyn Fair Fendigaid i fod yn fam i'th Fab: caniatâ, fel y bu iddi hi ddisgwyl ei ddyfodiad yn iachawdwr arnom, y bydd i ninnau fod yn barod i'w gyfarch pan ddaw drachefn yn farnwr arnom: yr hwn sy'n fyw ac yn teyrnasu gyda thi a'r Ysbryd Glân yn un Duw, yn awr ac am byth. **Amen.**

2 Samuel 7. 1-11, 16

Now when the king was settled in his house, and the Lord had given him rest from all his enemies around him, the king said to the prophet Nathan, 'See now, I am living in a house of cedar, but the ark of God stays in a tent.' Nathan said to the king, 'Go, do all that you have in mind; for the Lord is with you.' But that same night the word of the Lord came to Nathan: Go and tell my servant David: Thus says the Lord: Are you the one to build me a house to live in? I have not lived in a house since the day I brought up the people of Israel from Egypt to this day, but I have been moving about in a tent and a tabernacle. Wherever I have moved about among all the people of Israel, did I ever speak a word with any of the tribal leaders of Israel, whom I commanded to shepherd my people Israel, saying, 'Why have you not built me a house of cedar?' Now therefore thus you shall say to my servant David: Thus says the Lord of hosts: I took you from the pasture, from following the sheep to be prince over my people Israel; and I have been with you wherever you went, and have cut off all your enemies from before you; and I will make for you a great name, like the name of the great ones of the earth. And I will appoint a place for my people Israel and will plant them, so that they may live in their own place, and be disturbed no more; and evildoers shall afflict them no more, as formerly, from the time that I appointed judges over my people Israel; and I will give you rest from all your enemies. Moreover, the Lord declares to you that the Lord will make you a house. Your house and your kingdom shall be made sure for ever before me; your throne shall be established for ever.

2 Samuel 7. 1-11, 16

Wedi i'r brenin fynd i fyw i'w dŷ ei hun, ac i'r Argwlydd roi llonyddwch iddo oddi wrth ei holl elynion o'i amgylch, dywedodd y brenin wrth y proffwyd Nathan, "Edrych yn awr, yr wyf fi'n trigo mewn tŷ o gedrwydd, tra mae arch Duw yn aros mewn pabell." Ac meddai Nathan wrth y brenin, "Dos, a gwna bopeth sydd yn dy galon, oherwydd y mae'r Argwlydd gyda thi." Ond y noson honno daeth gair yr Argwlydd at Nathan, gan ddweud, "Dos, dywed wrth fy ngwas Dafydd, 'Fel hyn y dywed yr Argwlydd: A wyt ti am adeiladu i mi dŷ i breswylio ynddo? Yn wir, nid wyf wedi preswylio mewn tŷ o'r diwrnod y dygais yr Israeliaid allan o'r Aifft hyd heddiw; yr oeddwn yn mynd o le i le mewn pabell a thabernacl. Ple bynnag y bûm yn teithio gyda'r holl Israeliaid, a fu imi yngan gair wrth unrhyw un o farnwyr Israel, a benodais i fugeilio fy mhobl Israel, a gofyn, "Pam na fyddech wedi adeiladu tŷ o gedrwydd i mi?"" Felly, dywed fel hyn wrth fy ngwas Dafydd, 'Fel

hyn y dywed Argwlydd y Lluoedd: Myfi a'th gymerodd di o'r maes, o ganlyn defaid, i fod yn arweinydd i'm pobl Israel. Yr oeddwn gyda thi ple bynnag yr aethost, a dinistriais dy holl elynion o'th flaen, a gwneud iti enw mawr fel eiddo'r mawrion a fu ar y ddaear. Ac yr wyf am baratoi lle i'm pobl Israel, a'u plannu, iddynt gael ymsefydlu heb eu tarfu rhagor; ac ni fydd treiswyr yn eu cystuddio eto, fel yn yr adeg gynt, pan benodais farnwyr dros fy mhobl Israel; rhoddaf iti lonyddwch oddi wrth dy holl elynion. In the sixth month the angel Gabriel was sent by God to a town in Galilee called Nazareth, to a virgin engaged to a man whose name was Joseph, of the house of David. The virgin's name was Mary. And he came to her and said, 'Greetings, favoured one! The Lord is with you.' but she was much perplexed by his words and pondered what sort of greeting this might be. The angel said to her, 'Do not be afraid, Mary, for you have found favour with God. And now, you will conceive in your womb and bear a son, and you will name him Jesus. He will be great, and will be called the Son of the Most High, and the Lord God will give to him the throne of his ancestor David. He will reign over the house of Jacob for ever, and of his kingdom there will be no end.' Mary said to the angel, 'How can this be, since I am a virgin?' The angel said to her, 'The Holy Spirit will come upon you, and the power of the Most High will overshadow you; therefore the child to be born will be holy; he will be called Son of God. And now, your relative Elizabeth in her old age has also conceived a son; and this is the sixth month for her who was said to be barren. For nothing will be impossible with God.' Then Mary said, 'Here am I, the servant of the Lord; let it be with me according to your word.' Then the angel departed from her.

Luc 1. 26-38

Yn y chweched mis anfonwyd yr angel Gabriel gan Dduw i dref yng Ngalilea o'r enw Nasareth, at wyryf oedd wedi ei dyweddïo i ŵr o'r enw Joseff, o dŷ Dafydd; Mair oedd enw'r wyryf. Aeth yr angel ati a dweud, "Henffych well, tydi, yr un y rhoddodd Duw ei ffafr iddi! Y mae'r Arglwydd gyda thi." Ond cythryblwyd hi drwyddi gan ei eiriau, a cheisiodd ddirnad pa fath gyfarchiad a allai hwn fod. Meddai'r angel wrthi, "Paid ag ofni, Mair, oherwydd cefaist ffafr gyda Duw; ac wele, byddi'n beichiogi yn dy groth ac yn esgor ar fab, a gelwi ef Iesu. Bydd hwn yn fawr, a Mab y Goruchaf y gelwir ef; rhydd yr Arglwydd Dduw iddo orsedd Dafydd ei dad, ac fe deyrnasa ar dŷ Jacob am byth, ac ar ei deyrnas ni bydd diwedd." Meddai Mair wrth yr angel, "Sut y digwydd hyn, gan nad wyf yn cael cyfathrach â gŵr?" Atebodd yr angel hi, "Daw'r Ysbryd Glân arnat, a bydd nerth y Goruchaf yn dy gysgodi; am hynny, gelwir y plentyn a genhedlir yn sanctaidd, Mab Duw. Ac wele, y mae Elisabeth dy berthynas hithau wedi beichiogi ar fab yn ei henaint, a dyma'r chweched mis i'r hon a elwir yn ddiffrwyth; oherwydd ni bydd dim yn amhosibl gyda Duw." Dywedodd Mair, "Dyma lawforwyn yr Arglwydd; bydded i mi yn ôl dy air di." Ac aeth yr angel i ffwrdd oddi wrthi.

Library

Cathedral Library - The Cathedral Library is open to the public on Fridays and Mondays 2pm to 4pm. No bookings needed. Any Enquiries to: <u>Library@StDavidsCathedral.org.uk</u>. The Library is reached via a spiral medieval stone staircase adjacent to the Shrine of St David in the north presbytery aisle.

Cathedral Treasury - On public display in the Cathedral Treasury are rare artefacts and communion ware from the medieval, Tudor, Stuart and later periods. In the Library cases is one of the Cathedral's copies of the 403-year-old Welsh Bible from 1620 with its original wooden covers. Proceeds from the Donation Box go towards conservation and care of the Cathedral's Collection of Rare Books and artefacts.
