Almighty Father, whose Son was revealed in majesty before he suffered death upon the cross. Give us grace to perceive his glory, that we may be strengthened to suffer with him and be changed into his likeness, from glory to glory; who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. **Amen.**

## Colect

Hollalluog Dad, y datguddiwyd dy Fab mewn mawredd cyn iddo ddioddef angau ar y groes: dyro inni ras i ganfod ei ogoniant, fel y cawn ein cryfhau i ddioddef gydag ef a'n newid o ogoniant i ogoniant i fod yn debyg iddo ef; sy'n fyw ac yn teyrnasu gyda thi yn undod yr Ysbryd Glân, yn un Duw, yn awr a hyd byth. **Amen.**

## 2 Kings 2. 1-12

Now when the Lord was about to take Elijah up to heaven by a whirlwind, Elijah and Elisha were on their way from Gilgal. Elijah said to Elisha, 'Stay here; for the Lord has sent me as far as Bethel.' But Elisha said, 'As the Lord lives, and as you yourself live, I will not leave you.' So they went down to Bethel. The company of prophets who were in Bethel came out to Elisha, and said to him, 'Do you know that today the Lord will take your master away from you?' And he said, 'Yes, I know; keep silent.' Elijah said to him, 'Elisha, stay here; for the Lord has sent me to Jericho.' But he said, 'As the Lord lives, and as you yourself live, I will not leave you.' So they came to Jericho. The company of prophets who were at Jericho drew near to Elisha, and said to him, 'Do you know that today the Lord will take your master away from you?' And he answered, 'Yes, I know; be silent.' Then Elijah said to him, 'Stay here; for the Lord has sent me to the Jordan.' But he said, 'As the Lord lives, and as you yourself live, I will not leave you.' So the two of them went on. Fifty men of the company of prophets also went, and stood at some distance from them, as they both were standing by the Jordan. Then Elijah took his mantle and rolled it up, and struck the water; the water was parted to the one side and to the other, until the two of them crossed on dry ground. When they had crossed, Elijah said to Elisha, 'Tell me what I may do for you, before I am taken from you.' Elisha said, 'Please let me inherit a double share of your spirit.' He responded, 'You have asked a hard thing; yet, if you see me as I am being taken from you, it will be granted you; if not, it will not.' As they continued walking and talking, a chariot of fire and horses of fire separated the two of them, and Elijah ascended in a whirlwind into heaven. Elisha kept watching and crying out, 'Father, father! The chariots of Israel and its horsemen!' But when he could no longer see him, he grasped his own clothes and tore them in two pieces.

Jericho." Dywedodd yntau, "Cyn wired â bod yr Arglwydd yn fyw, a thithau, ni'th adawaf." Felly aethant i Jericho. Daeth y proffwydi oedd yn Jericho at Eliseus a dweud wrtho, "A wyddost ti fod yr Arglwydd am gymryd dy feistr oddi arnat heddiw?" "Gwn yn iawn," meddai yntau, "peidiwch â dweud." Dywedodd Elias wrtho, "Aros di yma oherwydd y mae'r Arglwydd yn f'anfon at yr Iorddonen." Dywedodd yntau, "Cyn wired â bod yr Arglwydd yn fyw, a thithau, ni'th adawaf." Felly aethant ill dau. Ac yr oedd hanner cant o broffwydi wedi dod ac aros gyferbyn â hwy o hirbell tra oeddent hwy ill dau yn sefyll ar lan yr Iorddonen. Cymerodd Elias ei fantell a'i rholio a tharo'r dŵr. Ymrannodd y dŵr i'r ddeutu, a chroesodd y ddau ar dir sych. Wedi iddynt groesi, dywedodd Elias wrth Eliseus, "Gofyn! Beth a wnafti iti cyn fy nghymryd oddi wrthyf?" Atebodd Eliseus, "Rhodder imi gyfran ddwbl o'th ysbryd." Dywedodd Elias, "Gwnaethost gais anodd. Os gweli fi yn cael fy nghymryd oddi wrthyf, fe gei hyn; ond os na weli, ni chei." Ac fel yr oeddent yn mynd, dan siarad, dyma gerbyd tanllyd a meirch tanllyd yn eu gwahanu ill dau, ac Elias yn esgyn mewn corwynt i'r nef. Ac yr oedd Eliseus yn syllu ac yn gweiddi, "Fy nhad, fy nhad; cerbyd a marchogion Israel!" Ni welodd ef wedyn, a chydiodd yn ei wisg a'i rhwygo'n ddau.

## **2 Corinthians 4. 3-6**

And even if our gospel is veiled, it is veiled to those who are perishing. In their case the god of this world has blinded the minds of the unbelievers, to keep them from seeing the light of the gospel of the glory of Christ, who is the image of God. For we do not proclaim ourselves; we proclaim Jesus Christ as Lord and ourselves as your slaves for Jesus' sake. For it is the God who said, 'Let light shine out of darkness', who has shone in our hearts to give the light of the knowledge of the glory of God in the face of Jesus Christ.

## **2 Corinthetaid 4. 3-6**

### Mark 9. 2-9

Six days later, Jesus took with him Peter and James and John, and led them up a high mountain apart, by themselves. And he was transfigured before them, and his clothes became dazzling white, such as no one on earth could bleach them. And there appeared to them Elijah with Moses, who were talking with Jesus. Then Peter said to Jesus, 'Rabbi, it is good for us to be here; let us make three dwellings, one for you, one for Moses, and one for Elijah.' He did not know what to say, for they were terrified. Then a cloud overshadowed them, and from the cloud there came a voice, 'This is my Son, the Beloved: listen to him!' Suddenly when they looked around, they saw no one with them anymore, but only Jesus. As they were coming down the mountain, he ordered them to tell no one about what they had seen, until after the Son of Man had risen from the dead.

### Marc 9. 2-9

Ymhen chwe diwrnod dyma Iesu'n cymryd Pedr ac Iago ac Ioan ac yn mynd â hwy i fynydd uchel o'r neilltu ar eu pennau eu hunain. A gweddnewidiwyd ef yn eu gŵydd hwy, ac aeth ei ddillad i ddisgleirio'n glaerwyn, y modd na allai unrhyw bannwr ar y ddaear eu gwynnu. Ymddangosodd Elias iddynt ynghyd â Moses; ymddiddan yr oeddent â Iesu. A dywedodd Pedr wrth Iesu, "Rabbi, y mae'n dda ein bod ni yma; gwnawn dair pabell, un i ti ac un i Moses ac un i Elias." Oherwydd ni wyddai beth i'w ddweud; yr oeddent wedi dychryn cymaint. A daeth cwmwl yn cysgodi drostynt; a dyma lais o'r cwmwl, "Hwn yw fy Mab, yr Anwylyd; gwrandewch arno." Ac yn ddisymwth, pan edrychasant o amgylch, ni welsant neb mwyach ond Iesu yn unig gyda hwy. Wrth iddynt ddod i lawr o'r mynydd rhoddodd orchymyn iddynt beidio â dweud wrth neb am y pethau a welsant, nes y byddai Mab y Dyn wedi atgyfodi oddi wrth y meirw.

### **Lent Course 2024**

Whether we're a bible geek or just a novice, whether we've been a Christian for years, or just starting out, most of us could do with finding ways to refresh our engagement with the Bible. So, for 5 Tuesdays in Lent, we plan to delve into a fascinating book called, *"How to eat bread – 21 nourishing ways to read the bible"* by Miranda Threlfall-Holmes. This practical, accessible, intellectually and spiritually refreshing book will help you to engage with and increase your understanding of this ancient library of texts.

Over the course of 5 weeks, through reading, discussion and good refreshments, all of us as a group will find new and interesting ways to engage with scripture.

There are two ways to engage with this Lent Course:

1. **Lent Daytime Course:** Weekly on Tuesdays afternoons in Lent. Meet at 1.50pm at the Cathedral Welcome Desk for a 2pm start. Class will last 90 mins. First session Tuesday 20<sup>th</sup> Feb, Final Session 19<sup>th</sup> March.
2. **Lent Evening Book Group** – Wednesday 20<sup>th</sup> March, 7.30pm at the Archdeaconry, The Close, St Davids. This is a **one night only** discussion of the book. To take part in this group you need to independently read the book (the first third). You will be sent 4 questions to think about before you come to the Book Group. You need to purchase a copy of the book (available in the Nave bookshop or on Amazon) to really make the best of the course.

**Cathedral Library** - The Cathedral Library is open to the public on Fridays and Mondays 2pm to 4pm. No bookings needed. The Library is reached via a spiral medieval stone staircase adjacent to the Shrine of St David in the north presbytery aisle.

**Cathedral Treasury** - On public display in the Cathedral Treasury are rare artefacts and communion ware from the medieval, Tudor, Stuart and later periods. In the Library cases is one of the Cathedral's copies of the 404-year-old Welsh Bible from 1620 with its original wooden covers. Proceeds from the Donation Box go towards conservation and care of the Cathedral's Collection of Rare Books and artefacts.

**Tour of Rarely Seen Parts of the Cathedral** - The next Tours in this series will be held during half term on Tuesday 13<sup>th</sup> February, 2pm-3.30pm and Tuesday 20<sup>th</sup> February 2pm-3.30pm. **Thrice to Rome - Saturday 23rd March. 2pm** - Dramatisation, in his own words, of Gerald of Wales' three attempts, between 1200 and 1203, in the Papal Court in Rome, to support of his election as Bishop of St Davids, which was opposed by Norman/English Kings, and for the metropolitan status of St Davids independent of Canterbury. Many of the issues are familiar to us in Wales 800 years later. Performed on the anniversary of the day Gerald was in the Cathedral in 1188 as part of his journey around Wales, recruiting for the 3rd crusade.
